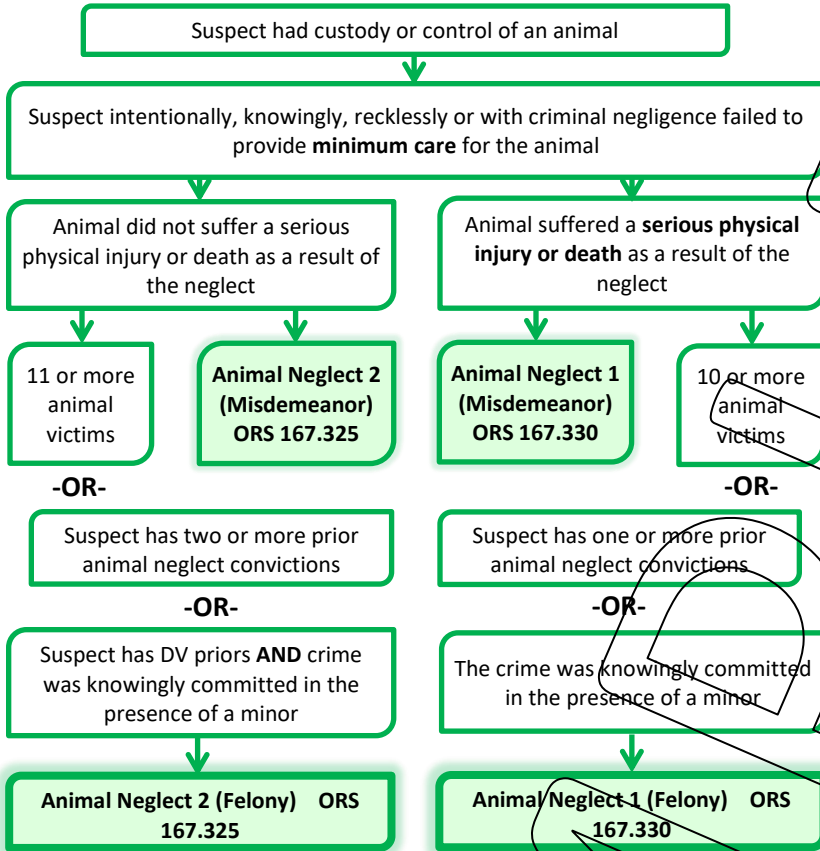
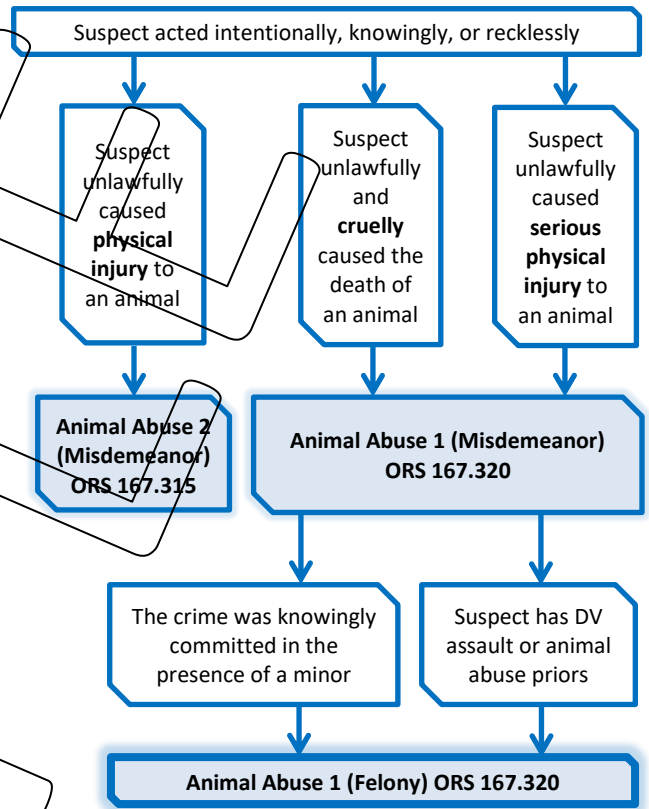


ANIMAL NEGLECT FLOW CHART

Animal definitions for Minimum Care ORS: **Animal** means any nonhuman mammal, bird, reptile, amphibian or fish. **Domestic animal** means an animal, other than livestock or equines, that is owned or possessed by a person. **Equine** means a horse, pony, donkey, mule, hinny, zebra or a hybrid of any of these animals. **Livestock** means rātties, horses, mules, jackasses, cattle, llamas, alpacas, sheep, goats, swine, domesticated fowl and any fur-bearing animal bred and maintained commercially or otherwise, within pens, cages and hutches.

Open or adequate access to potable **water** in sufficient quantity to satisfy the animal's needs. Access to snow or ice is not adequate access to potable water

Food of sufficient quantity and quality to allow for normal growth or maintenance of body weight

Veterinary care deemed necessary by a reasonably prudent person to relieve distress from injury, neglect or disease

For a **domestic animal**, continuous access to an area with adequate space for exercise necessary for the health of the animal; with air temperature suitable for the animal; and kept reasonably clean and free from excess waste or other contaminants that could affect the animal's health

Minimum care: care sufficient to preserve the health and well-being of an animal.

For a **domestic animal** other than a dog engaged in herding or protecting livestock, **access to adequate shelter**

Specifically includes **(but is not limited to)**

Does not include **emergencies** or **circumstances beyond the reasonable control** of the owner

For a **livestock animal** that cannot walk or stand without assistance, humane euthanasia; or the provision of immediate and ongoing care to restore the animal to an ambulatory state

Adequate shelter includes a barn, doghouse or other enclosed structure sufficient to protect a domestic animal from wind, rain, snow or sun, that has **adequate bedding** to protect against cold and dampness and that is maintained to protect the domestic animal from weather and physical injury

Adequate bedding means bedding of sufficient quantity and quality to permit a domestic animal to remain dry and reasonably clean and maintain a normal body temperature

Adequate shelter does not include: animal carriers or crates that are designed to provide temporary housing; crawl spaces under buildings or parts of buildings, such as steps, decks or stoops; the space under a vehicle; the inside of a vehicle if the domestic animal is kept in the vehicle in a manner or for a length of time that is likely to be detrimental to the domestic animal's health or safety; shelters with wire or chain-link floors, unless the domestic animal is a bird
